Employed identity markers across online spaces

Jul 2024 - Present

Using comparative historical methods, I am comparing the use of employed identity markers (EIMs) in different spaces and how they are used in different ways. Specifically, I am studying variations between YouTube and Reddit in polarized political spaces (i.e., highly liberal vs highly conservative) and comparing within political spaces and across community centers.

Algorithmic gender bias in large language models UC Davis

Jan 2024 - Present

As the lead author on a multidisciplinary, collaborative research team, I am responsible for ensuring that all members are consistently working toward the same goals, contributing during our weekly meetings, and making progress in our research. Our research surrounds LLMs and how, if given a gendered job description versus a gender neutral one, the LLM will convert the name of the gendered job description to that of a gender neutral one, but keep the salary, narrative, and responsibilities gendered. This is problematic as more people are turning to LLMs to do everyday tasks for them in the workplace. We will be testing this idea with a sample of over 70 different job descriptions and more than 1,000 iterations.

Peceptions of gender discrimination in the workplace

I am currently working on my qualifying project which aims to better understand not the formal reports of discrimination in the workplace that other studies have examined, but the perceptions of discrimination directly from the individuals experiencing it firsthand. More specifically, I ask is there a gendered relationship to the perception of discrimination in the workplace and, if so, does that change over time? I further inquire as to the joint effects of gender, supervisory status, and the size of the organization in maintaining gender discimination in the workplace over time.

Employed identity markers in YouTube Comments

I studied the way that YouTube commenters purposefully employed their identities in order to legitimize their comments and gain authority in conversations. I then trained ChatGPT4 to identify these employments and use the employed identity markers (EIMs) to contextualize their statements to better categorize them by political affiliation. I found that when statements contained explicit EIMs, ChatGPT4 had a higher success rate of correctly categorizing the statement by political affiliation than when the statement did not contain an EIM.

Foster youth perspectives about foster care: Experts on their own lives

Jan 2021 - Dec 2023

I worked with three other researchers to write a book that provides the perspectives of foster youth from more than 20 countries. It addresses a wide variety of topics (e.g., sense of belonging and security, knowledge of the foster care system, relationships with caregivers, and feelings about placement changes) in one easy-to-access location. In addition, we included a meta-analysis on contact with birth parents. Our major finding was that foster youth desired to be included in decisions made about their lives.

I conducted a content analysis of 86 companies registered as an ABA company in the Sacramento region. I studied their websites for information related to their leadership by sex and analyzed which roles held a higher or lower proportion of women compared to men.

I conducted a content analysis of the authors of 22 most highly recommended ABA books and the textbook list at one of the largest university ABA programs. Most of the books were authored by men, contributors were a mix of men and women (the proportions differed by text), and that men were more likely to be first author, while women were more likely to be in the last authorship position.

I helped conduct a literature review of attachment-based foster care programs on behalf of a foster youth advocate to present evidence to reverse the state of California's plan to close a local program. Our review and the advocate's report led to a reversal of the decision to close the facility.
